

ABSTRAK

An Overview Of Female Adolescents' Knowledge Regarding The Prevention Of Early-Age Pregenant At SMA Saraswati 1 Denpasar

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Early pregnancy is one of the reproductive health issues frequently experienced by adolescents and can lead to various negative physical, psychological, and social impacts. Low levels of knowledge regarding reproductive health and exposure to inaccurate information from the social environment are contributing factors to early pregnancy. This study aims to describe the knowledge level of female adolescents regarding the prevention of early pregnancy at SMA Saraswati 1 Denpasar. This research employed a descriptive design with a quantitative approach, involving 115 respondents selected using purposive sampling. The research instrument was a knowledge questionnaire that had been tested for validity and reliability. The results showed that most respondents had a high level of knowledge, with 108 participants (93.9%), while 7 participants (6.1%) had a moderate level of knowledge, and none showed a low level of knowledge. These findings indicate that the majority of female adolescents already possess a good understanding of efforts to prevent early pregnancy. The study concludes that continuous reproductive health education through schools, health workers, and parents is essential to strengthen adolescents' knowledge and prevent pregnancy at a young age.
